NINE TUESDAYS OF ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA

Beginning Tuesday, April 18th and concluding on the Feast of St. Anthony, Tuesday, June 13th. Many favors have been obtained by those who have made this Novena. Novena videos on the parish YouTube channel may be found under the playlist for the Nine Tuesdays of St. Anthony. Here are the rules:

- 1) Recite for nine consecutive Tuesdays the prayer or prayers you find most appropriate (these will be provided in the church and on the website)
- 2) Endeavor to imitate his virtues.
- 3) Receive within the period of the Novena, if possible, the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.
- 4) Promise alms for St. Anthony's Bread for the poor, if you have the means.

LESSER LITANIES/ROGATION DAYS - MAY 15-17th

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday May 15-17th: The three days prior to Ascension Thursday are a Triduum of their own preparing for the departure of the Lord. On these days, penitential litanies are prayed in procession with the Crucifix lifted high in the air, followed by Rogation Masses. Each day begins with Sung Vespers at 5 pm. The procession follows Vespers at approximately 5:30. Mass follows at approximately 6:15 or 6:30 pm. There will be no Confessions on Wednesday.

COULTER MCINTYRE CANDIDACY MASS - JUNE 18TH

A word from Seminarian Coulter McIntyre:

"I would like to invite you all to a special Mass with Archbishop Sample here at St. Stephen's, on Sunday, June 18 at 10:30 am, where I will be received as a candidate for Holy Orders. In the rite of Candidacy, I formally declare my intention to Archbishop Sample and the faithful of the archdiocese to be ordained as a priest. Generally, candidacy isn't received until shortly before ordination to the diaconate. Most seminarians are admitted to candidacy while at their respective seminaries. However, the major seminary where I am being sent (the Pontifical North American College in Rome) requires that I receive candidacy before I arrive there in July. Since I was given the option, I of course requested to celebrate this important step in my formation with you all at my home parish. I would love to see you all there and ask for your continued prayers.

OREGON RIGHT TO LIFE

There are three bills in Oregon of which Catholics should be aware.

-House Bill 2002: Removes age limits on minors receiving abortions, sterilizations or "gender-affirming" care and prohibits any information from being shared with a child's parents unless the child provides explicit, written permission.

-House Bill 2279: Removes the Oregon residency requirement for physician-assisted suicide, endangering vulnerable people outside of Oregon.
