PEDESTALS AVAILABLE FOR THE CHURCH: \$7,500

Recently a statue of St. John Berchmans was purchased for the church in honor of our great altar boys. We need a pedestal to place it on. We also moved the new Sacred Heart of Jesus statue to the Gospel side of the sanctuary, and St. Bernadette Soubirous was moved to the back wall of the nave. We have an opportunity to purchase these two pedestals which compliment each other, and compliment the other two pedestals along the back wall of the nave. These both come from Belgium, and would be fitting for St. John Berchmans and St. Bernadette to sit upon. The cost for the pair is \$7,500 (\$3,750 each). We will accept donations anytime under the "Centennial Side Chapel Fund."
