## A WORD FROM THE SUMMER SEMINARIAN:

We have now begun what is called the *tempus per annum*, that is, the time through the year. In the new calendar, it is called 'Ordinary Time', which can lead us to think of it as dull or mediocre. While the other liturgical seasons have a clearer purpose, do not think that this time exists simply to fill the gap between the great solemnities. However, in this sense, 'Ordinary' actually refers to the Sundays being ordered or numbered. This *tempus per annum* is ordered towards an end, which as Saint John Paul II writes in *Dies Domini*, "Sunday after Sunday the Church moves towards the final "Lord's Day", that Sunday which knows no end" (37). This time is for performing works of charity, practicing virtue, and growth in the spiritual life. Just as the weeks through the year are ordered towards an end, so too should our efforts in the spiritual life be ordered towards our ultimate end: eternal life.

## FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN, PASTOR

This coming Tuesday, July 7th marks the beginning date for a novena to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. I will be filming a series of videos for this novena. The history of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel is very interesting, going back to the earthly life of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the community of men living on Mount Carmel in the mode of Sts. Elias (Elijah) and Eliseus (Elisha), of the Old Testament. The Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel falls on Thursday, July 16th. This is a good time to be enrolled in the Brown Scapular if you have not yet been enrolled. The Brown Scapular is called, in Latin, a *habitus*; and in miniature, it serves as a habit when it is regularly worn. By enrollment in this scapular, one benefits from all the prayers and good works of the entire Carmelite Order. The Brown Scapular can be found at any Catholic Book Store, or purchased online. It is best to get a nice one that is sewn. The cheap ones are glued and will fall apart as soon as they get wet or stressed. Let us turn to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel to intercede for us at the hour of our death that we may be delivered promptly from Purgatory.
