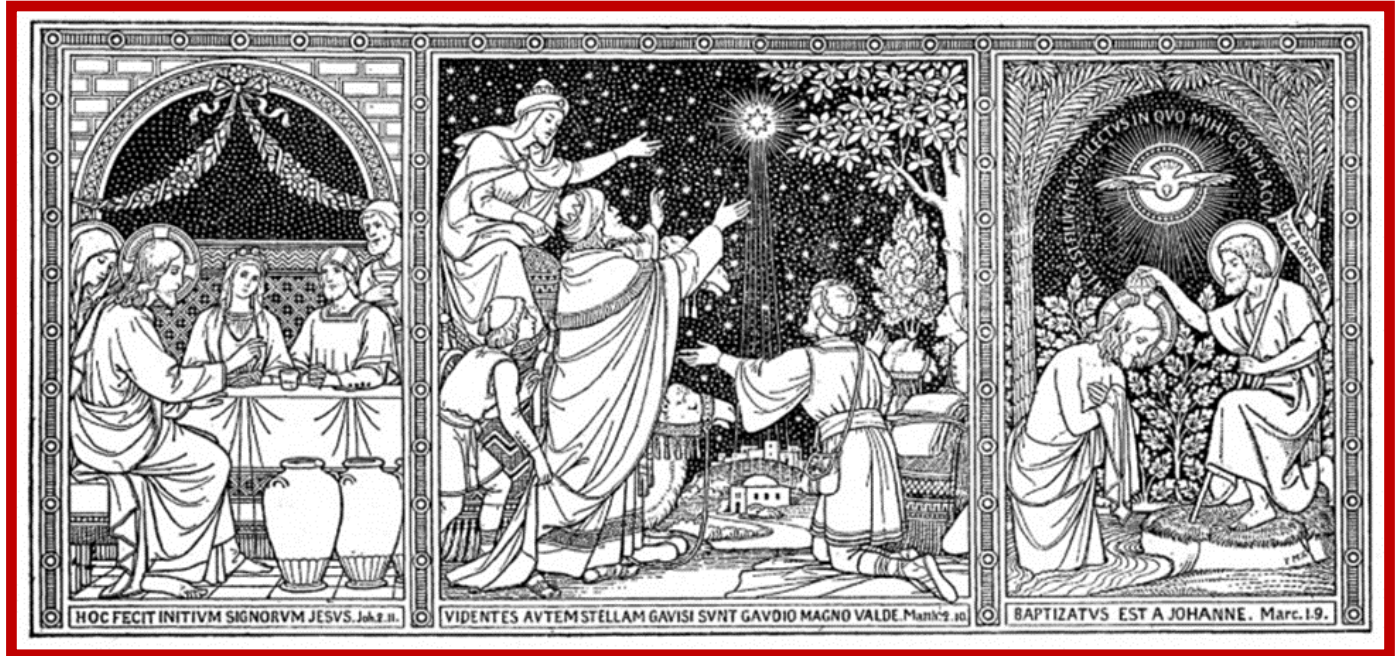

FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

Time After Epiphany-Per Annum (Ordinary Time)

The Commemoration of the Baptism of the Lord falls on the Octave Day of the Epiphany and remembers the second of three mysteries celebrated on the Epiphany. The Star of Bethlehem was the instrument by which Jesus was made manifest as the Son of God Incarnate as a baby in the manger. Our Lord Jesus is anointed as the Christ by the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove and made manifest by the voice of the Father: "This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased." Next Sunday, the third mystery of the Epiphany will be observed in the Extraordinary Form Latin Mass when the Gospel is that of the Wedding at Cana at which Jesus manifests Himself as GOD by changing water into wine.

Having celebrated three weeks of the Epiphany and having entered into the Season After Epiphany, there is still a remnant of the Christmas Season until February 2nd, the 40th Day of Christmas which finally brings the Christmas Season to a conclusion. At the same time, we will have changed from the white of Christmas to the green vestments of Ordinary Time even for the Second Sunday after Epiphany when we commemorate the final mystery of that feast with the Gospel of the Wedding at Cana. These are the layers of the liturgical year which are woven together and celebrated concurrently.

This whole month of January is dedicated to the Holy Name of Jesus. It is also the month we need to participate in various things having to do with the Pro-Life movement. The ladies of the parish are invited to this month's Ladies Holy Heart Mini-Retreat on Wednesday, January 22nd which is the US Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. You will also see in the bulletin the March for Life at the State Capitol in Salem on Saturday, January 25th at 2:30 pm. Please make every effort to attend this event. We will have a good contingent from the parish present with a banner. You will be in good company.

Also, put on your calendar that the Novena for Candlemas begins on Friday, January 24th to end on Saturday, February 1st. Candlemas is the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin and the Presentation of the Child Jesus in the Temple on February 2nd. In preparation for this great feast we will pray the novena as a parish and commence our first Rosary Walk of 2020 on First Saturday, February 1st at 11 am. Please join us for a great pilgrimage around the parish boundaries (6.8 miles).

ROSARY WALK

Saturday, February 1st, 2020. This month's Rosary Walk will honor of the Nativity of the LORD as we prepare for Candlemas on February 2nd, ending the 40 days since the Nativity. It is also a First Saturday in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary. 11:00 am: Meet in the church for prayer / 11:15 am: Rosary Walk commences. 6.8 mile long pilgrimage around the parish boundaries. Bring your Rosary and money for coffee and lunch at St. Honoré.

Help me then, O Lord, as I investigate how much our natural reason can learn about that true being which you are if we begin with the being which you have predicated of yourself" (God as First Principle ¶1.2).
