### **FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN**

Each year, as All Souls Day approaches, it is good to revisit the Church's teaching on Indulgences for the Dead since they are generally misunderstood. "An indulgence is a remission of the temporal punishments which a penitent, whose sins are forgiven, has yet to undergo, either here or in purgatory; this remission is granted by the Church, through the power of the keys, from the treasury of the superabundant merits of Christ and His saints" (Pohle-Preuss. The Sacraments: A Dogmatic Treatise. Vol. III: Penance. Dogmatic Theology Vol. X. St. Louis, MO: B. Herder, 1947, pg. 236).

The remission of punishments called an indulgence is not an unconditional amnesty, but postulates in the recipient a moral disposition or worthiness, as well as the performance of certain prescribed acts. For this reason, the moral worthiness of the recipient is not endangered by an indulgence, but rather partly taken for granted and partly effected. Charity or the love of God is the font and well-spring as well as the gauge and a necessary condition of the whole system of indulgences (p. 235). The Church expressly teaches that indulgences presuppose the forgiveness of sins, either through the Sacrament of Penance or by an act of perfect contrition. An indulgence does not forgive sins but merely remits the punishments due to sins. (p. 236)

The scriptural argument is based on the universal character of the power of the keys. ...The power of the keys includes the faculty of loosening (*facultas solvendi*) as well as that of binding. (cf. Matt XVI,19; Matt XVIII, 18).

Indulgences for the dead, unlike indulgences for the living, are not granted in the form of a judicial absolution, owing to the fact that the poor souls in purgatory are no longer subject to the jurisdiction of the Church (cf. p. 259). But if this is so, how can the Pope authoritatively grant indulgences to the dead? ...In the strict sense the Church can exercise her power of jurisdiction only over those who are her subjects through Baptism. The jurisdiction she has over catechumens and pagans is confined to preaching the word of God and exercising a certain guidance over them (cf. Matt XXVIII, 19). It is only in this wider sense of the term that the power of the keys can be said to extend to the poor souls in purgatory. The Church simply offers to God from the treasury of merits at her command an equivalent satisfaction with the request to remit any remaining punishments to the extent of the indulgence offered. This is called the application of an indulgence by way of suffrage (*per modum suffragii*). The poor souls receive these indulgences not directly, but indirectly, through the intercession of the living. A living Christian must first gain an indulgence for himself before he can make use of the privilege of applying it to the poor souls. (pp. 259-260). The chief reason why indulgences are applicable to the poor souls is that the Communion of Saints comprises the inmates of purgatory as well as the elect in Heaven and the militant Church on earth. (261).

#### **PLENARY INDULGENCE ALL SOULS: NOV 1-8**

**Visiting a Cemetery:** An indulgence is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the dead. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. This indulgence is a plenary one from November 1 through November 8 and can be gained on each one of these days. On the other days of the year this indulgence is a partial one. (Coemeterii visitatio. Grant #13. Enchiridion Indulgentiarum, 1986).


**Prayer for the Dead:** "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen." [*A partial indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory* (Requiem aeternam. Grant #46)].

**Visiting a Church or an Oratory on All Souls Day:** A plenary indulgence which is applicable only to the souls in purgatory is granted the Christian faithful who devoutly visit a church or an oratory on All Souls Day. [*This visit is to include the recitation of the Lord's Prayer and the Creed {Pater et Credo} (Visitatio ecclesiae vel oratorii in Commemoratione omnium fidelium defunctorum. Grant #67)*].
