FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

This next Saturday is our 9th Rosary Walk around the parish boundaries. It has been called to my attention that on July 13th, 1917, when Our Lady of Fatima appeared for the third time to the children, one of the images they saw was an angel with a flaming sword who called out, "Penance, penance, penance!" Let us take up this duty with zeal and joy as we head out to walk and pray for souls: our own poor souls and those who are most needy!

As this is our ninth Rosary walk, we can also be reminded that there are nine choirs of angels. This walk can be in honor of Our Lady, Queen of Angels and those nine choirs. St. Thomas Aquinas, keeping with Dionysius the Areopagite, "divides the angels into three hierarchies, each of which contains three orders." So, there are three sets of three. They are ranked and ordered according to their proximity to God, the Supreme Being: "In the first hierarchy he places the Seraphim, Cherubim, and Thrones; in the second, the Dominations, Virtues, and Powers; in the third, the Principalities, Archangels, and Angels" (cf. Pope, Hugh. "Angels." The Catholic Encyclopedia. 1907).

It is reasoned that our guardian angels are assigned to us from among all nine choirs of angels according to our needs, our talents, and our personality. To understand this, let's look back at each of the nine choirs of angels to see what each of them do. Venerable Prosper Gueranger writes:

"God reserves to the Seraphim, Cherubim, and Thrones the honor of following His Own immediate court. The Dominations, from the steps of His throne, preside over the government of the universe; the Virtues watch over the course of nature's laws, the preservation of species, and the movements of the heavens; the Powers hold the spirits of wickedness in subjection. The human race in its entirety, as also its great social bodies, the nations and the churches, are confided to the Principalities; while the Archangels, who preside over smaller communities, seem also to have the office of transmitting to the Angels the commands of God, together with the love and light which come down even to us from the first and highest hierarchy." (The Liturgical Year. Vol. XIV. Feast of the Guardian Angels).

Each of us has a holy guardian angel. That holy angel will have been taken from among these nine choirs of angels and during the time of our life on earth, that angel will serve us and guard and protect us. He will encourage us to virtue and holiness. Parents should pray to the guardian angels of their children for their children's needs and protection. Likewise a pastor should pray to the guardian angels of all souls entrusted to his care, for their well being, encouragement and protection. With this in mind, we make this ninth Rosary Walk in honor of these nine choirs and the guardian angels of all who live and work in the parish and those who visit. As has become the custom, some may walk barefoot along all or part the pilgrimage as an offering of penance. If you plan to do so, please bring a pair of sandals or shoes along with you in case of emergency, hot pavement, or injury. You will also need shoes/sandals in order to enter into St. Honoré and buy something and to use the restroom.

Watch for special prayers and devotions in the coming days and months to increase our devotion to the Holy Guardian Angels.
