FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

A few weeks ago, I posed the question: "Now what?" after we had completed the 7 Rosary Walks, the Consecration of the Parish, and the individual consecrations of individuals and families in the parish. Now, that question naturally comes up again. Now, that Lent is over, now what? The immediate thing that comes to the fore is that, after these 40 days of self-denial, at last one can eat chocolate, or drink wine, or coffee, or Facebook, or whatever it was that a person has given up for Lent.

But think back to the Lenten goals you made and signed six weeks ago. One of the goals was to give up something that is a vice. A second goal was to abstain from something that is good. A third goal was to take on something that is good - prayer, good works, sacrificial acts, etc.

Now that Lent is over, look back over your goals from six weeks ago. Lent is a testing ground for moving forward into Easter. Lent should teach each one of us something about him/herself. The vice that you intended to give up: did you find yourself strengthened to give it up based upon abstinence and good works? Yes? Very good. Continue to give it up. Find a good balance in your life now and remember that every Friday throughout the year is intended to be a Lenten day. Fridays help to preserve the foundation upon which we built during Lent. Relive Lent every Friday. If you found that fasting and abstinence brought joy to your life, consider that Easter is about joy, not about indulgence. Feast during Easter, but do so in a virtuous way. If you have enjoyed eating simply and austere, consider continuing to do so on Wednesdays and Fridays, the ancient days of Christian fasting in remembrance of Judas' betrayal on Wednesday, and Christ's Passion on Friday.

Did you find that you could do without the good thing from which you abstained? Consider giving that good thing up, for the sake of giving the vicious thing up. Enjoy that good thing on Sundays, or on special occasions. Thursday is a good day during the week to enjoy a nice meal, in remembrance of Holy Thursday - the Last Supper and the Institution of the Holy Eucharist.

Did you discover a new good work during Lent? Did you spend more time reading the Holy Scriptures, or going to daily Mass, or praying a Holy Hour during the week? Good! Continue to do so with Easter joy. Those good works are a foretaste of the heavenly life. Did you discover joy in serving the poor, or walking with the Urban Missionaries, or joining your priest on his Rosary Walks? Good! Continue to do so with Easter joy.

May this Lent not have been wasted, and if it was, be humbled and get a fresh start. If this Lent was fruitful, give thanks to God and spend this Paschaltide not regressing or falling into gluttony, but progressing in the spiritual life and growing closer to Jesus in your day-to-day life.
