FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

This past Thursday commemorated Holy Thursday with a different emphasis. Holy Thursday anticipates the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, and so begins the Sacred Triduum. This past Thursday, however, the Feast of Corpus Christi commemorates Holy Thursday, but looks back upon the institution of the Holy Eucharist. As St. Thomas Aquinas writes in the hymn for Matins of Corpus Christi:

“We are commemorating the Last Supper when, as we believe, Christ gave to his brethren the lamb and the unleavened bread, according to the law given to their fathers in former times.”

Today, we are celebrating the External Solemnity of Corpus Christi. This means that the Solemnity was observed on its proper day—last Thursday—with the offering of Mass and the praying of the Office of Corpus Christi, but for the sake of the greater number of the faithful, we also celebrate the Mass of Corpus Christi today on Sunday so that the greatest number of the faithful can enjoy the feast and take part in the procession.

Our annual procession was shortened last year because we wanted to encourage families to attend the Archbishop’s Procession in the North Park Blocks downtown. This year, we are having our full procession after the 10:30 am Mass and also encouraging people to attend the Archbishop’s Procession.

I recently heard that, while twenty years ago, seminarians were concerned with teaching correct doctrine about the Eucharist, they are more concerned now with the Liturgy as a means of catechesis. This makes sense. For decades, we have heard that alarming percentages of Catholics do not believe that the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ, really and truly present under the appearance of bread and wine. So much doctrine has been taught, and yet still people do not believe. Why is that?

We must look to the Liturgy. How do we treat the Most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist? Do we treat it as though it were merely a symbol? a piece of bread to be handled and passed around? Or do we treat it as GOD, to be adored, kneeled before and reserved to be touched only by the consecrated and anointed hands of the priest? Those are important questions and depending upon how one answers them, the answers have huge consequences in faith.

John Calvin insisted that people must receive Holy Communion standing and in the hand to prove that they did not believe it was Jesus Christ, but only a symbol. That should cause us to stop and think about how many of us were taught to receive Holy Communion only on the tongue and never to touch it because it is too holy.

The Liturgy should be our primary instruction on the Eucharist. If the Eucharist is GOD, then it should be treated like GOD. That is why the Traditional Latin Mass is making such a comeback. It is unmistakable in its treatment of the Eucharist as the True Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ. Liturgy and Doctrine are not in conflict with one another.

The Feast will be celebrated **today at the 10:30 am Mass** as an external Solemnity. Sung Latin Mass at St. Stephen’s will be followed by an outdoor Procession. Please consider also joining Fr. Andersen **today at the Cathedral** for an Ordinary Form Pontifical Mass with Archbishop Sample at 2 pm followed by a Eucharistic Procession through the Pearl District to the North Park Blocks and back. There will be no Vespers this evening at St. Stephen’s.
