#### FROM THE DESK OF FR ERIC ANDERSEN

This month of July kicks off with the Solemnity of the Precious Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We will be celebrating First Vespers of the solemnity this evening (Sunday) at 5 pm and a Sung Latin Mass on Monday evening at 7 pm. Pius Parsch writes: "The feast of the Most Precious Blood continues the mystery of redemption proper to Good Friday..." It is an appropriate follow up to Corpus Christi on which we commemorated Holy Thursday and adored the Most Holy Body of Christ. Now we will adore the Precious Blood, calling upon Jesus to cover us with the Blood of the Lamb for our protection and sanctification.

The antiphons from First Vespers of the feast prefigure the Blood of Christ:

**Antiphon 1:** Who is this that comes from Edom, in crimsoned garments, from Bosra — this one arrayed in majesty?

**Antiphon 2:** "It is I. I who announce vindication, I who am mighty to save."

**Antiphon 3:** He was clothed in a garment sprinkled with blood, and His name is called the Word of God.

**Antiphon 4:** Why is Your apparel red, and Your garments like those of the wine presser?

**Antiphon 5:** "The wine press I have trodden alone, and of My people there was no one with Me."

The antiphons from the Office of Matins take us through a meditation on the Precious Blood of Christ:

**Antiphon 1:** When eight days were fulfilled for the Child's circumcision, His name was called Jesus.

**Antiphon 2:** Falling into an agony He prayed the more earnestly.

**Antiphon 3:** Judas who betrayed Him, repented and brought back the thirty pieces of silver, saying, "I have sinned in betraying innocent blood.

**Antiphon 4:** Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, delivered Jesus to them scourged.

**Antiphon 5:** Seeing, however, that he was doing no good, he took water and washed his hands in sight of the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of the blood of this Just Man."

**Antiphon 6:** And all the people answered and said, "His blood be on us and on our children."

**Antiphon 7:** Jesus therefore came forth, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple cloak. And he said to them, "Behold the Man!"

**Antiphon 8:** And bearing the cross for Himself, He went forth to the place called the Skull, where they crucified Him.

**Antiphon 9:** And when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs; but one of the soldiers opened His side with a lance, and immediately there came out blood and water

The antiphons from the Office of Lauds apply the Blood of Christ those who have triumphed:

**Antiphon 1:** These who are clothed in white robes, who are they, and whence have they come?

**Antiphon 2:** These are they who have come out of the great tribulation, and have washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb.

**Antiphon 3:** Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve Him day and night.

**Antiphon 4:** And they overcame the dragon through the blood of the Lamb and through the testament of His Word.

**Antiphon 5:** Blessed are they who wash their robes in the blood of the Lamb.

## VENERATION OF THE RELIC OF ST. MARIA GORETTI

This coming Saturday, July 6th is the feast of St. Maria Goretti, the martyr of purity. We will celebrate the usual Holy Hour of Adoration on Saturday morning at 8 am, followed by Low Latin Mass at 9 am. At the end of the Mass, we will pray the First Saturday Devotion and the faithful will be invited to kneel at the communion rail while the reliquary is brought to each person for a blessing. Confessions will be heard afterwards during the praying of the Rosary.

#### FIRST SATURDAY MASS & DEVOTIONS

On First Saturdays, we pray an Act of Reparation for First Saturdays after Mass followed by the Rosary during Confessions. This devotion "consists in going to Confession, receiving Communion, reciting five decades of the Rosary and meditating for a quarter of an hour on the mysteries of the Rosary on the first Saturday. Confession may be made during the eight days preceding or following the first Saturday of each month, provided that Holy Communion be received in the state of grace. Should one forget to form the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, it may be formed at the next Confession, the occasion to go to confession being taken at the first opportunity." Please join us this month after morning mass this Saturday, July 6th.
