FROM THE DESK OF FR. ERIC ANDERSEN

Two years ago, while on retreat with the Norbertines at St. Michael's Abbey, I began reading an English translation of the The Holy Bible, as prepared by Mons. Ronald Knox. His translation was prepared in the mid-20th century and is now being republished. Just before beginning my retreat last week, I finished reading the 2nd Book of Maccabees, completing the Old Testament two years after I started. I began my current retreat here in Oklahoma with the Gospel According to St. Matthew, thereby beginning the New Testament. This seems like a fitting way to begin a new year and a new retreat.

The first time I read the Bible straight through was around the year 1999, when I was in my late 20s. I bought a copy of The Jerusalem Bible, published in 1966. The Jerusalem Bible was a project of French scholars at the Ecole Biblique in Jerusalem as a result of the finding of the Dead Sea Scrolls. I remember the Jerusalem Bible as being very literary in its English style and enjoyable to read.

While I was in the seminary, I had classes on various genres and most of the books of the Bible, but these were not read nor taken in the same order in which they are compiled in the Bible itself. The version preferred by Mount Angel Seminary was the RSV-Catholic Edition, published by Ignatius Press. This translation is an updated and Catholicized edit of the King James Bible, made doctrinally acceptable for Catholics, and granted an imprimatur in 1966.

In January 2015 I was privileged to be able to lead a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. That inspired me to pick up the Bible and start again to read it straight through cover to cover. I began that January with the Douay-Rheims which is the traditional English translation for Catholics completed by exiled priests from England in 1582 (New Testament) and 1609 (Old Testament). This translation is very accurate since it is a literal translation from the Latin. The language was updated by Richard Challoner in 1749-1752.

It's a wonderful experience to read the Bible cover to cover. The Old Testament ends on a high note with the heroism of the Maccabees, after having suffering with the covenant people through so much infidelity along the way. But as heroic as the Maccabees are, there is a striking difference between them and the Person one encounters when he turns the page from the Old Testament to the New Testament. Jesus Christ is altogether different. He speaks and acts with authority! He is altogether a Man like no other because He is God. His divinity breaks through the pages and one is brought to his knees in encountering Him.

Traditionally, Septuagesima Sunday is the day to begin the Bible with Genesis. The traditional Divine Office will begin with the Creation account from Genesis in the lessons of Matins, next Sunday February 17th. If it has been awhile since you picked up the Bible, or if you have ever thought that you would like to read it cover to cover, this would be a good time to start. Be sure that you have a Catholic Bible and get started. I assure you, it will change your life and draw you closer to your LORD and GOD.
